(A) within 15 miles of the boundary of a military base, as defined by Section 43.0117, at which an active training program is conducted; and

(B) in a county with a population of more than two million;

DAVIS: I understand that, and I don't have a problem with that part of the bill. I'm just trying to understand. One of the challenges has been regarding people being able to access the DROP funds that they're putting into the account. Does this change that at all? Will it allow for members to get—those who might want to draw their monies down, will it allow for them to do that?

ANCHÍA: It does not change that ability.

DAVIS: So at this point we're going to extend it from 10 to 20 years and we're not allowing members, if they have a need, or want, to get their monies down. They cannot do it. Is that right?

ANCHÍA: That is not covered by this bill. This only changes the eligibility criteria.

DAVIS: Good. And so the other question I have relative to that has to do with hardship: Does it change the language? Last year, we attempted to address hardship. Some of the families whose members were police or fire officers were deceased, but the members could not get access to funds for hardship. Does it change any of that language?

ANCHÍA: It does not. This is a rifle-shot approach, only changing eligibility criteria.

The amendment would require the commission to certify that it is refraining from an action that is not expressly prohibited by the bill. Because it is not a validly phrased limitation, it is not germane.

Accordingly, the point of order is well-taken and sustained.

The ruling precluded further consideration of Amendment No. 1.

Representative Tinderholt raised a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 4419** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2), of the House Rules. The speaker sustained the point of order, announcing his decision to the house as follows:

Mr. Tinderholt raises a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 4419** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2), on the grounds that the analysis is materially misleading.

In establishing a statutory scheme for the rebate of certain taxes in connection with film and television production in this state, the bill defines several key terms. The bill analysis explains some, but not all, of these definitions, which are critical in understanding eligibility for, and the operation of, the tax rebate program established by the bill. Because the analysis does not include the definitions for all key terms, it is materially misleading. *See* 87 H. Jour. 3032 (2021).
