

SUBJECT: Nonsubstantive additions and corrections

DIGEST: SB 959, as amended, would codify without substantive change various statutes omitted during prior recodifications, conform codifications enacted by the 73rd Legislature to other laws enacted by that legislature that did not amend the new codes and make other corrections and changes such as renumbering statutes with duplicate numbers.

If a law enacted by the 74th Legislature affects a provision repealed or redesignated by SB 959, the repealed provision or previous designation would remain in effect, and in case of conflict a law enacted by the current legislature would control. The bill would take effect September 1, 1995.

NOTES: The committee amendment would make additional nonsubstantive corrections and revisions. The House on April 10 suspended the printing rule, and the text of SB 959 was not printed as part of the committee report due to its length.
