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SB 1838 also would increase fees from:

- \$2 to \$5, for searches of records if written evidence of the search was required;
- \$25 to \$40, for maintenance of records of service for foreign and domestic limited liability corporations and shift this fee from the Texas Business Corporation Act to Sec. 405.031 of the Government Code; and
- from \$5 to \$10, for a certified copy of a record.

The bill would eliminate the \$300 filing fee for articles of consolidation under the Texas Business Corporation Act.

SB 1838 would take effect September 1, 1997.
