DIGEST: HB 2782 would allow a public junior college or junior college district to sell,

> lease, or otherwise convey property to a university system for less than the fair-market value of the property. For this to occur, the governing board of the junior college or district would have to determine that the transfer of property would promote a public purpose related to higher education within the service

area of the college or district.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record

vote of the membership of each house.

**SUPPORTERS** 

SAY:

Land transfers under HB 2782 could facilitate the expansion of universities at reduced cost. The growth of universities provides significant public benefits to all state residents. Educational institutions around the state have developed

plans for property transfers and are waiting for statutory authority to proceed with these plans. This bill would ensure that universities would develop the

transferred property for the benefit of the public good.

**OPPONENTS** 

SAY:

No apparent opposition.

NOTES: A similar bill, SB 1289 by Zaffirini, which passed the Senate on April 19 and

the House on May 11, would allow political subdivisions and industrial

development corporations, as well as public junior colleges, to transfer land to

institutions of higher education for less than fair-market value.
