SUPPORTERS SAY:	HB 871 explicitly would exempt from the sales tax the sale and adopt stray, homeless, abandoned, or unwanted animals impounded at nonpr animal shelters. Some shelters do not collect these taxes now because consider adoption fees to be contributions. An explicit exemption wou lower administrative costs for shelters that now collect the tax. It also lower the cost of adopting a stray animal, increasing the likelihood that animals would find loving homes.
