BACKGROUND: Local Government Code, sec. 334.024 permits a municipality or county to

hold an election on a resolution authorizing the planning, acquisition, development, construction, or renovation of a sports or community venue provided the project will have no major fiscal impact on state revenue. An

election authorized for these purposes must:

• designate the project and allow for a vote separately on each venue project; and

• designate the proposed methods of financing and allow for a vote on each method that the municipality or county wants to use to finance the project and the maximum rate of each.

Current statutory provisions do not expressly authorize local governments to hold an election to reassign a portion of tax proceeds from a venue project for the improvement or maintenance of a facility after its original authorization.

DIGEST: CSHB 1524 would add Local Government Code, sec. 334.0242 to allow a

governing body of a municipality or county to call an election on the use of revenue from approved methods for financing a venue project. If approved, a municipality or county could use the revenue to finance a related venue project. The ballot would be based on model language in the bill, allowing voters to authorize a percentage of tax revenue or a dollar

amount from the specified tax to finance the related project. A

municipality or county could not change the tax rate previously authorized in the original election approving the venue.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2007.
