DIGEST: HB 2018, as amended, would codify, without substantive change, various

statutes omitted during prior recodifications; conform codifications enacted by the 79th Legislature, particularly the Special District Local Laws Code and titles of the Insurance Code, to other laws enacted by that Legislature that did not amend the new codes; and make other corrections

and changes, such as renumbering statutes with duplicate numbers.

If a law enacted by the 80th Legislature affected a provision repealed or redesignated by HB 3167, the repealed provision or previous designation would remain in effect, and, in cases of conflict, a law enacted by the

current Legislature would control.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2007.

SUPPORTERS SAY:

HB 3167 is the nonsubstantive clean-up bill compiled by the Texas Legislative Council and enacted by the Legislature each regular session to make correcting and conforming changes to the statutes. During a legislative session, more than one bill may add or amend the same section or subsection of a statute, resulting in duplicate numbering or lettering. Also, when new areas of the law are recodified, portions of existing law have to be amended to conform to the new codes. This bill is considered a nonsubstantive revision of the law under Art. 3, sec. 43 of the Constitution and thus does not violate the prohibition in Art. 3, sec. 35 against a bill,

other than a general appropriations bill, having more than one subject.
