BACKGROUND: In 2009, the 81st Legislature enacted SB 1646 by Van de Putte, creating

the Council on Children and Families to help improve the coordination of state services for children. The council includes the executive leadership from health and human services agencies, juvenile justice agencies, the

Texas Education Agency, the Workforce Commission, and four

representatives from the general public. The council is administratively attached to the Texas Health and Human Services Commission, but is

independent in direction.

DIGEST: SB 717 would expand the purposes of the Council on Children and

Families to include promoting the sharing of information regarding children and their families among state agencies. The bill would require the council to identify technological methods to ensure the efficient and timely transfer of information among state agencies providing health,

education, and human services to children and their families.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2011.
