DIGEST: SB 554 would enhance the penalty for theft of an official ballot or official

carrier envelope for an election from a state jail felony (180 days to two years in a state jail and an optional fine of up to \$10,000) to a third-degree felony (two to 10 years in prison and an optional fine of up to \$10,000).

The bill would take effect September 1, 2013, and would apply only to an

offense committed on or after that date.
