DIGEST:	HB 3685 would require the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) to comply with state and federal fair	

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housing laws in adopting a qualified allocation plan for the low-income housing tax credit program. The department could not implement a qualified allocation plan or any component of that plan in a way that did not comply with those laws.

In returning a rejected application for a qualified allocation plan to the applicant, the department would have to include an explanation to the applicant as to why the application failed to satisfy the threshold criteria.

HB 3685 would apply to applications made for low-income housing tax credits submitted to TDHCA during an application cycle based on the 2018 qualified allocation plan or a subsequent adopted plan.

The bill would take effect September, 1, 2017.
