BACKGROUND: Health and Safety Code sec. 828.001(2) defines a releasing agency as a

public or private animal pound, shelter, or humane organization. The term

does not include an individual who occasionally renders humane assistance or shelter in the individual's home to a dog or cat.

DIGEST: CSHB 2347 would require an animal shelter or releasing agency,

including an animal rescue organization, to scan an animal to determine whether a microchip was implanted in the animal as soon as practicable after the animal was placed in the custody of the shelter or releasing

agency.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2019.
