DIGEST:

HB 2588 would require the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) to develop and administer a program under which TWC could award grants to nonprofits that facilitated veterans' and active-duty military service members' participation in apprenticeship training programs in Texas while they were transitioning into civilian employment.

TWC would adopt rules as soon as practicable after the effective date of

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the bill for the administration of the grant program, including rules for verifying that state funds awarded to nonprofit organizations were being used appropriately.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2019.

NOTES:

According to the Legislative Budget Board, the bill would have a negative impact of \$600,000 on general revenue related funds through fiscal 2020-21.
