DIGEST:	HB 3132 would require the staff development for classroom te provide reading instruction to students in kindergarten or infirs or third grade to include training in:	
	• effective and systematic instructional practices in reading including phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocab comprehension; and	•

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• the use of empirically validated instructional methods appropriate for assisting struggling readers.

The bill would apply beginning with the 2019-2020 school year.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2019.
