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DIGEST: HB 3207 would amend statute to consolidate the Port Authority Advisory Committee's reporting requirements.

> The port capital program would be renamed as the maritime port mission plan. Information included in the program would be carried over to the plan, and the plan would be updated and submitted to the governor, lieutenant governor, House speaker, and Texas Transportation Commission by December 1 of each even-numbered year.

> The bill would remove the requirement that the Port Authority Advisory Committee prepare a report every two years on Texas maritime ports that included project and funding information.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2019.
