DIGEST: HB 3755 would require the Texas Department of Public Safety to contract with a third party to conduct a study on improving the process of issuing

driver's licenses in the state. The study would have to examine:

• the process for issuing driver's licenses in Texas, including metrics on the time between application for and receipt of a driver's license:

- technological advancements in the issuance of driver's licenses, including the development of digital driver's licenses;
- the procedures for issuing driver's licenses in other states; and
- best practices for issuing driver's licenses.

The department would be required to submit a report containing the study's findings and recommendations to the governor, lieutenant governor, and members of the Legislature by May 1, 2020. The bill's provisions would expire September 1, 2020.

The bill would take immediate effect if finally passed by a two-thirds record vote of the membership of each house. Otherwise, it would take effect September 1, 2019.
