have the opportunity to be buried in uniform if state agencies do not provide uniforms after an officer's retirement. HB 315 would give these officers a way to purchase uniforms, ensuring that those who wanted a uniform were able to acquire one.

There would be no cost to the state because the uniforms would be offered for purchase at market value, although an agency could provide them for free or at a reduced cost if it chose to do so. The bill also would allow an agency to provide the current uniform worn by commissioned peace officers of the agency and would not require that the retired officer be issued a uniform that he or she actually wore while serving.
