SUPPORTERS SAY:	HB 105 would ensure students from all colleges and universities state could access their academic transcript without having to p tax. Currently, students who attend public colleges and universe request copies of their academic transcripts without having to p tax, even if they pay a fee for the service. However, students at private schools are charged sales tax when requesting their trans-	bay sales ities may bay sales tending

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from a private school. HB 105 would provide parity so that no matter where a student attended college, the student would not be subject to sales tax when requesting an academic transcript.

CRITICSHB 105 should ensure all fees related to a student's transcript would beSAY:exempt from sales tax. Universities are incurring higher costs and are
passing those costs on to students in the form of additional and higher
fees. Additional fees related to transcripts may include separate fees to
