BACKGROUND: Concerns have been raised that firing a gun into the air with no intended

target, as often occurs on New Year's Eve and Fourth of July in the form

of celebratory gunfire, can cause injuries and death.

DIGEST: CSHB 1138 would expand conduct constituting discharge of a firearm in

certain municipalities to include recklessly discharging a firearm in a county with a population of 500,000 or more. The offense would not affect the authority of a county or municipality under other law to enact an

order or ordinance prohibiting the discharge of a firearm.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023, and would apply only to an

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offense committed on or after that date.
