BACKGROUND: General Government Code Sec. 2308.304 describes the components that

local workforce development boards must consider and include in their

local plans, including a strategic and an operational component.

Some have suggested that including individuals ages 16 to 24 in the population segments of local workforce development boards' local plans

could reduce the number of these individuals who are unemployed and not

enrolled in school.

DIGEST: HB 2302 would require that a local workforce development board include

in its local plan individuals who are at least 16 years old and younger than 25 years old in establishing specific goals, objectives, and performance

measures for segments of the population targeted for various services

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using resources from the Texas Workforce Commission.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023.
