BACKGROUND:

Concerns have been raised that government agencies and non-governmental organizations are unable to track and record data related to people experiencing homelessness.

DIGEST:

HB 2533 would require the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) to use available resources and collaborate with the Texas Homeless Network to implement a homeless data sharing network through which homeless response systems and data warehouse vendors are able to share and assess real-time data on homelessness

throughout the state.

In implementing the network, TDHCA would collaborate with health benefit plan issuers and managed care organizations to identify individuals experiencing homelessness and connect and refer those individuals to available resources for the purpose of improving health outcomes. TDHCA would be required to ensure that confidential information shared through the network was not disclosed.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023.
