DIGEST: HB 608 would add Diwali, including the five days preceding the holiday,

to the periods during which county commissioners' courts may allow

licensed retailers to sell fireworks.

The Texas A&M Forest Service would have to be available, per any county's request, to determine whether drought conditions existed in the

county during the Diwali fireworks season.

A county's order to prohibit or restrict the sale or use of fireworks due to a determination that drought conditions existed would have to be adopted at

least 15 days before the beginning of the Diwali fireworks season.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2023.
