- BACKGROUND:** Some have suggested that creating measures to evaluate the performance of courts can increase efficiency, reduce costs, and promote public transparency.
- DIGEST:** HB 841 would require that the Texas Judicial Council include case-level information on the amount and character of the business transacted by courts among the judicial statistics and other pertinent information it collects. The Texas Judicial Council would be required to adopt rules necessary to implement the bill.
- The bill would take effect September 1, 2023.
- NOTES:** According to the Legislative Budget Board, the bill would have an estimated negative impact of about \$6 million to general revenue related funds through fiscal 2024-25, with reduced costs in subsequent biennia.
