### **DIGEST**

Currently, Texas law requires the legislature to pass concurrent resolutions to name state-owned buildings. In the 73rd Legislative Session, the General Services Commission Sunset bill included a provision for the purchase and renovation of a state office building in McLennan County--the Raleigh Building in Waco. This resolution authorizes the Raleigh Building to be named the Raleigh Hotel/Abner McCall Building in honor of one of the state's most beloved citizens.

### **PURPOSE**

As proposed, S.C.R. 85 submits the following resolution:

That the 75th Legislature of the State of Texas hereby direct that the Raleigh Building in Waco be named the Raleigh Hotel/Abner McCall Building in honor of one of the state's most beloved leaders and citizens; and

That the secretary of the state forward an official copy of this resolution to the executive director of the General Services Commission.

### **SUMMARY OF COMMITTEE CHANGES**

Amendment 1.

Page 3, line 14, changes the name of the building from the Abner McCall Building to the Raleigh Hotel/Abner McCall Building.
