DIGEST

Currently, Texas law authorizes the creation of special purpose districts for the education of students in special situations whose educational needs are not adequately met by regular school districts. S.B. 1060 increases the number of members who can serve on the boards of trustees of certain special-purpose school districts.

PURPOSE

As proposed, S.B. 1060 increases the number of members who can serve on the boards of trustees of certain special-purpose school districts.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

This bill does not grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION. 1. Amends Section 11. 352(a), Education Code, to require the State Board of Education to appoint for each district established under Section 11.351 a board of three, five, or seven trustees. Provides that a trustee is not required to be a resident of the district. Makes conforming changes.

SECTION 2. Emergency clause.
Effective date: upon passage.
