#### **DIGEST**

Currently, Texas law authorizes The University of Texas System to levy a student union fee not to exceed \$30 per student for each regular semester and \$15 per student for each term of the summer session for purposes of maintaining and operating a student union building at The University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP). The summer program has since changed and is now one "long" summer session. S.B. 746 would increase the maximum student union fee for summer sessions exceeding nine weeks to \$30, and continue to charge a maximum \$15 fee for students enrolled in a summer session of less than nine weeks.

# **PURPOSE**

As proposed, S.B. 746 establishes student union fees at The University of Texas at El Paso during summer sessions.

## **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

## **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Section 54.535(a), Education Code, to authorize the board of regents of The University of Texas System to levy a student union fee not to exceed \$30 for a summer session of nine weeks or more, and not to exceed \$15 for a summer session of less than nine weeks. Makes conforming changes.

SECTION 2. Emergency clause.

Effective date: upon passage.
