## BILL ANALYSIS

## DIGEST AND PURPOSE

Currently, when a vehicle is purchased through a loan, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) issues an original paper title to the lienholder and a nonnegotiable copy of the title to the purchaser of the vehicle. The lienholder is required to store the original title until the loan is paid in full. When a loan is paid in full, TxDOT must issue one original paper title to the vehicle owner. An electronic system for lienholders would remove the administrative burden placed on a lienholder in the processing, filing, and storage of paper titles. As proposed, H.B. 1535 allows TxDOT to issue electronic titles to lienholders.

## RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

Rulemaking authority is expressly granted to the Texas Department of Transportation in SECTION 1 (Section 501.117, Transportation Code) of this bill.

## SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Amends Chapter Chapter 501F, Transportation Code, by adding Section 501.117, as follows:

Sec. 501.117. ELECTRONIC LIEN SYSTEM. (a) Requires the Texas Department of Transportation (department) by rule to develop a system under which a security interest in a motor vehicle may be perfected, assigned, discharged, and canceled electronically instead of by record maintained on a certificate of title. Provides that participation by a lienholder in the system is voluntary.
(b) Requires the department to publish and distribute procedures for using the system to county assessor-collectors and to financial institutions and other potential motor vehicle lienholders.
(c) Provides that the provisions of this chapter relating to perfecting, assigning, discharging, and canceling a security interest in a motor vehicle by record maintained on a certificate of title do not apply to the extent the security interest is governed by rules adopted under this section.
