DIGEST AND PURPOSE

The purpose of H.B. 2810 is to take into account the new census data contained in the 2000 federal census and to update population brackets as necessary so that the statutes using those brackets continue to apply to the political subdivisions for which the brackets were intended.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

This bill would change the population limits used in various statutes to reflect 2000 census figures, thus leaving in place those provisions in the statute for which any activity is limited based on population brackets. As a result, the political subdivisions for which the original population limits were applicable would continue to be the only political subdivisions affected.

Provides that this Act is not intended to revive a law that was impliedly repealed by a law enacted by the 76th Legislature or a previous legislature.

Provides that to the extent that a law enacted by the 77th Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, conflicts with this Act, the other law prevails, regardless of the relative dates of enactment or the relative effective dates.

Effective date: September 1, 2001.
