## DIGEST AND PURPOSE

Currently, there are no statutes that properly identify or give state recognition to Native American tribes. As proposed, S.B. 1406 requires the governor to appoint a committee to study the need for establishing a commission on Native American affairs.

## **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

## SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. (a) Requires the governor to appoint a committee to study the need for establishing a commission on Native American affairs. Requires the committee to consist of six members appointed by the governor, with at least one Native American member.

- (b) Requires the committee, not later than December 1, 2002, to report its recommendation to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives.
- (c) Provides that this Act expires and the committee is abolished on June 1, 2003.

SECTION 2. Effective date: September 1, 2001.
