## **DIGEST AND PURPOSE**

Currently, the owner of a commercial vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer used by a nonprofit disaster relief organization, such as the Red Cross, may be exempt from vehicle registration fees. To gain the benefit of the exemption, an applicant must provide a statement by the county sheriff that the vehicle has not been used for any purpose other than emergencies. Because a sheriff may not have personal knowledge concerning a vehicle, this provision can be an unnecessary administrative burden. As proposed, S.B. 299 eliminates the requirement that the statement be made by the county sheriff.

## **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

## **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Section 502.203(b), Transportation Code, to require an application for registration under this section to include a statement by the owner of the vehicle that the vehicle has not been used for any purpose other than emergencies. Deletes the requirement that the application include a statement by the county sheriff that the vehicle was never used for any purpose other than emergencies.

SECTION 2. Effective date: September 1, 2001.

Makes application of this Act prospective.
