DIGEST AND PURPOSE

The Interagency Council on Autism and Pervasive Developmental Disorders (council) was created in 1987 for the purpose of developing a state plan to provide services to persons with autism or a pervasive developmental disorder. As proposed, S.B. 361 updates the composition of the council and allows for expenditures for staff and reimbursement for council members.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Amends Section 114.003(b)-(e) and (g), Human Resources Code, as follows:

- (b) Provides that the Interagency Council on Autism and Pervasive Developmental Disorders (council) is composed of seven, rather than two, public members, the majority of whom are family members of a person with autism or a pervasive developmental disorder, and one representative from each of certain state agencies, to serve as ex officio members, including the Interagency Council on Early Childhood Intervention. Deletes language requiring the appointment of the representatives by the commissioner of the respective agency.
- (c) Requires the commissioner or executive head of each state agency to appoint a person as that agency's representative. Limits the capacities of an ex officio member.
- (d) Entitles a public member to compensation and reimbursement of the travel expenses incurred by the public member while conducting the business of the council, as provided in the General Appropriations Act. Deletes text prohibiting such compensation and reimbursement. Makes a conforming change.
- (e) Makes conforming changes.
- (g) Makes a conforming change.

SECTION 2. Amends Section 114.004, Human Resources Code, to authorize the council to employ staff and expend funds on staff salaries. Deletes language prohibiting expending funds on staff salaries.

SECTION 3. Repealer: Section 114.006(c) (State Plan), Human Resources Code.

SECTION 4. Requires the governor, as soon as possible after the effective date of this Act, to appoint five new members to the council as required by Section 114.003, Human Resources Code, as amended by this Act.

SECTION 5. Effective date: September 1, 2001.
