DIGEST AND PURPOSE

Currently, Texas faces certain challenges to develop water policies that serve state and regional interests. The Texas Constitution authorizes the creation of groundwater conservation districts to plan, develop, and regulate the use of water. C.S.S.B. 1947 creates the Heritage Groundwater Conservation District, subject to approval at a confirmation election, to manage groundwater resources in the parts of Brooks, Jim Wells, Kleberg, and Nueces counties.

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.
