### **AUTHOR'S/SPONSOR'S STATEMENT OF INTENT**

Current Texas law authorizes the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) to issue a sticker for a license of an individual who has changed his or her address and to issue a disability health certificate to an individual who has a disability or health condition that impairs the ability to drive.

H.B. 1789 repeals such requirements since these licenses and certificates have never been requested.

### **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

### **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Section 521.054(b), Transportation Code, to delete a reference to Section 521.054(d).

SECTION 2. Amends Section 521.424, Transportation Code, to delete a fee for a duplicate disability certificate or duplicate health condition certificate.

SECTION 3. Repealer:

- (1) Sections 521.054(d) (relating to applying for a duplicate license or certificate), (e) (relating to payment for duplicate license or certificate), and (f) (relating to the forms required under Subsection (d)), Transportation Code;
- (2) Section 521.102 (Disability or Health Condition Certificate), Transportation Code;  
and
- (3) Section 521.423 (Fee for Disability Certificate or Health Condition Certificate);  
Transportation Code.

SECTION 4. Effective date: September 1, 2005.
