### **AUTHOR'S/SPONSOR'S STATEMENT OF INTENT**

Currently, under the Open Meetings Act, public notice is posted for the time, place, and subject matter of meetings of governmental bodies. Although, from a practical standpoint, few people actually receive this notice, there is need to provide Texans with information regarding the activities of local governmental bodies.

As proposed, S.B. 1133 broadens the requirements of the Open Meetings Act, by requiring certain local governmental bodies and economic development corporations that maintain websites to post notice of meetings as well as the entire agenda packets of those meetings on their websites. Only entities with a population of 48,000 or more would be required to post their entire agenda packet.

### **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

### **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Subchapter C, Chapter 551, Government Code, by adding Section 551.056, as follows:

Sec. 551.056. ADDITIONAL POSTING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN MUNICIPALITIES, COUNTIES, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICTS, AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATIONS. (a) Provides that this section applies only to a governmental body or economic development corporation that maintains an Internet website (website) or for which a website is maintained.

(b) Requires, in addition to the other place at which notice is required to be posted by this subchapter, certain governmental bodies and economic development corporations to also concurrently post notice of a meeting on the website of the governmental body or economic development corporation.

(c) Requires certain governmental bodies and economic development corporations to also concurrently post the entire agenda packet for the meeting on their website.

SECTION 2. Makes application of this Act prospective to September 4, 2005.

SECTION 3. Effective date: September 1, 2005.
