

PROCLAMATION

BY THE

Governor of the State of Texas

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

WHEREAS, the Forty-first Legislature at its First Called Session passed House Bill No. 192, being "AN ACT dealing with the compensation of Grand Jury Bailiffs pay of Bexar County, Texas, and automobile expenses"; and,

WHEREAS, said Bill has been vetoed for the reasons set out in the following statement, which has been filed with said Bill in the office of the Secretary of State:



NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, THAT I, DAN MOODY, Governor of the State of Texas, under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, have vetoed said Bill for the reasons stated and on file, and do hereby proclaim said action to have been taken.

House Bill No. 192, which is attached hereto, being "AN ACT dealing with the compensation of Grand Jury Bailiffs pay of Bexar County, Texas, and automobile expenses", is hereby vetoed.

This Bill provides for an increase of One Dollar (\$1.00) per day in the compensation paid Riding Grand Jury Bailiffs in counties having a population of 150,000, or more. The Bill provides that this increase in compensation is to defray the automobile expenses and upkeep and that it is to be in addition to his regular compensation.

By the terms of Chapter 217, page 320, Acts of the Fortieth Legislature, the compensation of Riding Grand Jury Bailiffs in counties of more than 150,000 population is fixed at Six Dollars (\$6.00) per day. It appears to me that this is sufficient compensation to meet any ^{Automobile} expenses which they might incur.
